I. Aim/Scope of the JIES Journal

II. Review Process

Submitted paper will go through a double-blind reviewed process. The author(s) will expected to receive feedback from 6-12 weeks.

III. Initial Submission Guideline

1. The paper should use APA style for a) figures and tables, and b) references.
2. Submitted papers should be double-spaced and should not exceed 30 pages, including references. The font size is 12 point. The first pages should be a title page which includes: title of the paper, name(s) of author(s), affiliations, and an abstract of 120 words. The second page includes the short biographies of author(s). The third page to the end of the paper should not show the name(s) of the author(s).
3. Submitted papers should not have been previously published or be currently under review for publication elsewhere.
